

Saint John Comper: 27 July



Margaret's, Gallowgate in Aberdeen).

Reverend John Comper (1823–1903) was a Priest of the Episcopal Church in Scotland who dedicated his life to helping the street children and prostitutes of Victorian Aberdeen. In 2003 Father Comper was declared a 'Hero of the Faith' by the Scottish Episcopal Church – the equivalent of a saint and the greatest hon our the Church can bestow. In the Calendar of the Scottish Episcopal Church he is remem bered on 27 July, the day of his death.

As rector of St John's, Aberdeen he opened a a church run day school and also invited the Sis ters of St Margaret to establish a convent (closed in 2003) to assist in the work of the church and area. His loving care for the poor led him to leave St John's and dedicate his life to them through St Margaret's Mission (now St
