

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

Father Dolling (1894):

(Robert William Radclyffe Dolling (10 February 1851 in Magheralin, County Down, Northern Ireland – 15 May 1902 in South Kensington, London, England), often referred to as "Father Dolling", was an Anglican priest. He was much loved and respected and worked, throughout most of his life, in "slum" parishes among the poor and forgotten.)

"War still exists . . . but the Divine Carpenter will have His revenge and His revenge will be complete when by means of labour, war shall cease throughout the whole world . . . when shameful wages and shameful hours and the abominable sweating system, depriving men of the fruits of their labours, shall have ceased universally . . . then the patient pleadings of the Carpenter of Nazareth will be realized, and man -- the temporal redeemer of the earth by the sweat of his brow -- shall refuse to be manipulated by his

brethren, either in the sweating dens of financiers, or on the battle-field, or in the armies maintained at present at an impossible cost by politicians or by monarchs for their own selfish purposes."
