In order to provide greater flexibility and cost efficiencies, the Committee wishes to make changes to the strategy which would have implications for the SEC's Ethical Investment Policy. The Committee is aware that that there will be a range of views throughout the SEC in relation to the proposed change and recognises that the issue should be discussed by General Synod later this year. To help inform both the Committee's thinking on the issue and General Synod's discussion of it the Committee will shortly be contacting vestries and others within the SEC providing more information about the proposed change and inviting comment on it. The Committee would welcome contributions from any members of the SEC. The information, including a link to the online survey, will shortly be made on the SEC website
