In accepting the report, the Vestry recorded its thanks to the Treasurer for his sterling work and for appraising the Vestry so meticulously.

5 Church Committees:

- a) **St John's** Minute previously circulated.
- b) **St Andrew's** No meetings had taken place.
- c) St Regulus Minute previously circulated.
- d) The Fabric Committee Bill Fraser reported that since the last meeting several relatively minor issues had been dealt with a blocked drain at St Andrews was repaired, two small heaters were installed in the toilet and vestry at St Regulus and the floor in the Rectory was repaired. The Secretary will apply to the Lottery Funding in respect of electrical work required in all the Church buildings.
- e) **The Mission and Ministry Committee** The committee met this week and a Minute of the meeting will be circulated in due course.
- f) **Fund Raising Committee** The Minute of the Fund-raising Committee will be circulated with this Minute.
- g) **PVG Safeguarding** All matters up to date.
- h) **Health & Safety** Fire Extinguishers it was agreed that we proceed with the quote from MacGregor Fire to replace the powder extinguishers in St Andrews at a cost of £236.05

6. **AOCB:**

- Planning Permission adjacent premises. The secretary alluded to correspondence received from the Council regarding the installation of solar panels in a property opposite the Church. It was agreed that we would have no objection to the planning consent.
- SEC Investment Committee the Secretary reported that the SEC Investment Committee were engaged in a consultation exercise prior to going to General Synod with a proposal to change the current investment strategy to one involving pooled funds which would in effect give no say in any ethical matters. After some debate on the matter the Vestry Secretary was instructed to contact the Committee and inform them that the Vestry of the Black Isle Charge would wish to see the current ethical strategy remain in place.
- Bill Fraser raised a point about recognising and acknowledging members of the Charge who had given outstanding service to the Church over many years. After discussion it was agreed that if any Vestry Member identified anyone

falling into that category, they should inform the Vestry Secretary who would write to the individuals and thank them personally for their contribution to the Charge.

- It was agreed that Joint Services would take place on the following dates 31st March -St Johns; 30th June – St Regulus; 29th September – St Andrews and the Charge AGM would take place on Sunday 8th December which would count as the 5th Sunday service for December.
- It was further agreed that the Vestry dates for the remainder of the year would be -24^{th} April / 19th June / 18th September / 20th November all meetings taking place at 19.30 hours in St Andrews.

Close: The meeting was closed at 20.45 hours. A vote of thanks was recorded to the Chairman.
