The Charity Shop in Academy Street brings in much needed income to the Black Isle Charge but it relies on volunteers to keep it going.

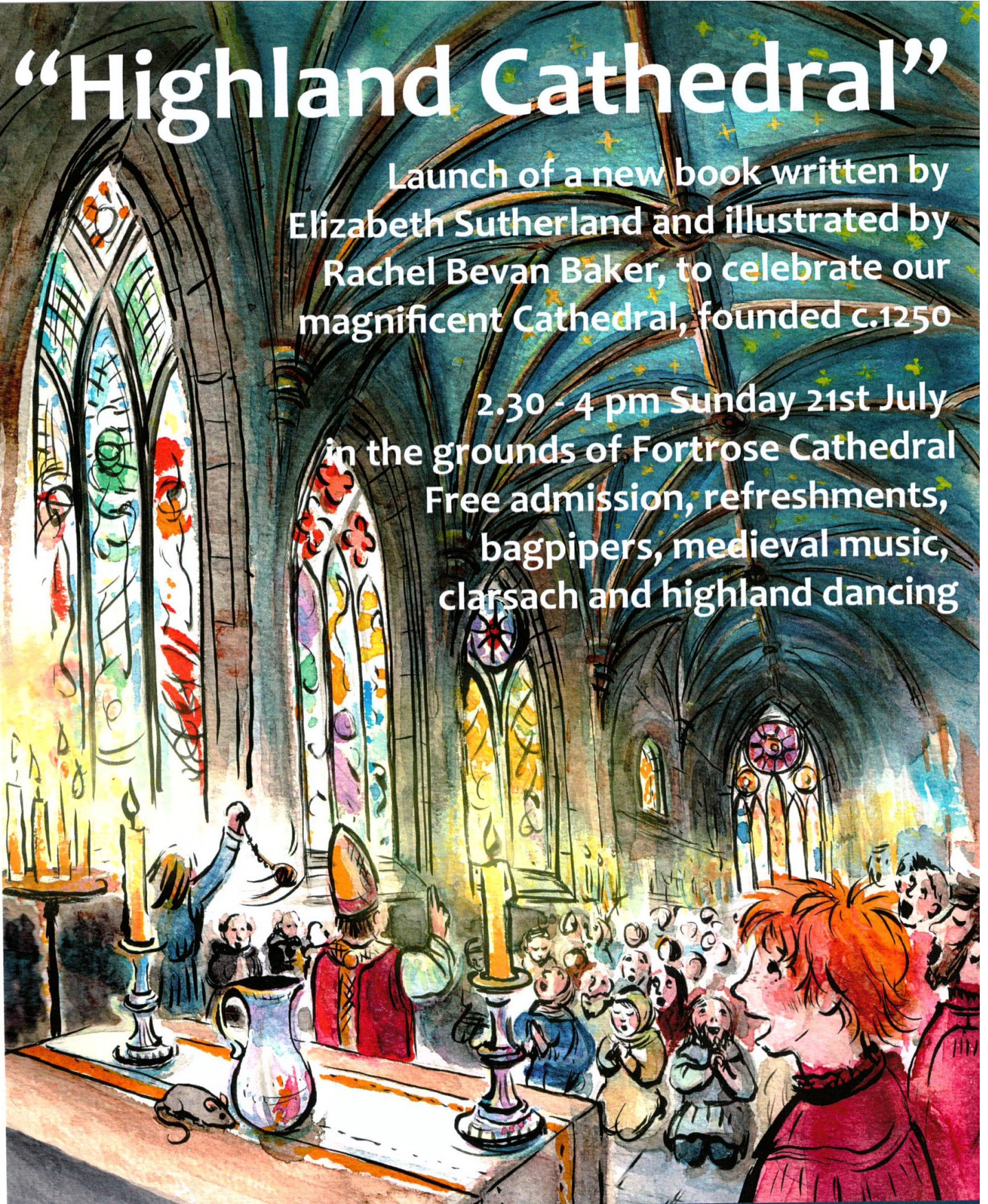
Not only does it generate income but it provides a focal point for locals and visitors alike.
