SAINT NINIAN (16 Sept)

Ninian was born in about the year 360 and was the son of a Cumbrian chieftain who had himself converted to Christianity. It seems he visited Rome in his youth, where he received training in the faith. He was consecrated bishop in the year 394 and returned to Britain, where he set up a community of monks at Candida Casa from where they went out on missionary journeys as far as Perth and Sterling. Ninian died in about the year 432.

"Dear friends, here is an update certificate from Blythswood on the Black Isle Charge's donations to the Highland Foodbank - 383.54kg from Jan-Jul 2019!! Well done! The staff at Blythswood are always very appreciative of all our donations on behalf of those who they go to help - the specific items that we have been collecting (rice, tins of tomatoes, corned beef, and pet food) are still all very useful. When you are choosing what to donate, it might be helpful to know that they tend to have plenty of soup, pasta, baked beans and cereal, and that they are often short of oatcakes and crackers. All items need to be non-perishable, in-date, and in unopened original packaging. There is a supply of bags next to the donations box that can be used and which will then be recirculated.

The Foodbank are running a special Harvest Appeal, and below is a poster which details the specific items that they have asked up to collect. St Andrew's Harvest Festival will be Sunday 6th October, and donations can be placed under the alter in the week leading up to that Sunday. Thanks again to you all."
