THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

Collect

Lord God our redeemer, who heard the cry of your people and sent your servant Moses to lead them out of slavery, free us from the tyranny of sin and death, and by the leading of your Spirit bring us to our promised land; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

+ Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 2:1-8


You yourselves know, brothers and sisters, that our coming to you was not in vain, but though we had already suffered and been shamefully mistreated at Philippi, as you know, we had courage in our God to declare to you the gospel of God in spite of great opposition. For our appeal does not spring from deceit or impure motives or trickery, but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the message of the gospel, even so we speak, not to please mortals, but to please God who tests our hearts. As you know and as God is our witness, we never came with words of flattery or with a pretext for greed; nor did we seek praise from mortals, whether from you or from others, though we might have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle among you, like a nurse tenderly caring for her own children. So deeply do we care for you that we are determined to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you have become very dear to us.

+ The Holy Gospel: Matthew 22:34-46

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them this question: "What do you think of the Messiah? Whose son is he?" They said to him, "The son of David." He said to them, "How is it then that David by the Spirit calls him Lord, saying,

'The Lord said to my Lord, "Sit at my right hand, until I put your enemies under your feet"? If David thus calls him Lord, how can he be his son?" No one was able to give him an answer, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask him any more questions.

Some time ago, I submitted a Notice on a Booklet written by Bishop E Luscombe and Stuart Donaldson on 'The Life and Times of Robert Lyon', Priest, Rebel & Martyr. Elizabeth (Betty) Marshall wrote a short review.

We have discussed together the most informative Booklet on Bishop Duncan MacInnes described below. Julie

A new Booklet has been compiled, printed and ready for distribution. The authors have collected stories on 'The Life and Times of Bishop Duncan MacInnes', Bishop of Moray, Ross & Caithness from 1953 - 1970.

Duncan MacInnes was born in Ballachulish in 1897 and attended St John's Church - my home village and church. During his ministry, he became the Rector of St Mary's Church, Glencoe.

Importantly, as Remembrance Sunday draws near, Duncan, as a young man, served in the 7th Battalion Argyll & Sutherland Highlanders as a Chaplain. For his outstanding service, he was awarded the Military Cross.

In his funeral oration 'Soraidh Leibh - Farewell', in St Andrew's Cathedral, Inverness, Bishop Moncrieff said of Duncan, that "few Dioceses can have had a more faithful or devoted pastor. He was called upon to exercise his episcopate at a time when what are called 'the winds of change' were blowing more vigorously than they had done for four hundred years." Bishop Duncan was the last native Gaelic speaking Bishop in the Scottish Episcopal Church—I have a recording of him taking a Gaelic service in St John's Church in 1954.

Visitor Details

Should you have any visitors attending your church you need to get their details for the Track and Trace list. You need to get their Name, Phone Number, and note the date of their visit and email this, ALONG with the regular congregation's names who were in attendance, every Sunday after the service to Ramsay.

This allows Ramsay to be the point of contact for the Track and Trace system for The Charge should any member be unfortunate enough to get the disease.

For those attending church during the Covid outbreak we have an information sheet for you to assess your personal risk with an explanation attached. This is used within the NHS and other Churches. We DO NOT want to know your personal score but would ask that you confirm either be email or in writing that you have received and read the form. Spare copies will be available in church for visitors etc.

Stewards and Co-ordinators need to ensure that details of everyone who attended the service are passed to the Vestry Secretary by email by each Sunday night. This needs to be undertaken to meet the Track and Trace section of the legislation.
