Last Sunday we the lit the Candles of **Hope** and **Peace**. Today is the Third Sunday of Advent (also known as Gaudete Sunday) and we light the **Candle of JOY** and remember John the Baptist.

In those days, Matthew tells us, John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.' This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said, 'The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight."

What do you say about yourself?" He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord," as the prophet Isaiah said. Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. They asked him, "Why then are you baptizing if you are neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal." This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.

Christmas Day Services

Given that the three Churches will be holding Christmas Day Services, it does not mean we can have as many as we like in each church. The Laws, Advice and Guidelines laid down by the Scottish Government and the Scottish Episcopal Church must be strictly adhered to. Failure to comply could result in criminal proceedings and adverse publicity at worst or the churches being closed by the Bishop for non-compliance but at the heart of the matter is the well being and safety of our members. That is paramount.

Accordingly entry to any of the three services will need to be booked ahead. In order to comply with the 2 metre rule none of our three churches can exceed a number of twenty. This can be slightly amended with family groups sitting in the one group but, that apart, the 2 metre rule will apply, use of hand gel on entry will be mandatory as will the wearing of masks. There will be NO Carol singing.

I have attached a Word document to this weeks' newsletter - it can be completed online and emailed back to me. All forms should be with me no later than the 21st but will be allocated on a first come basis. I will send you confirmation which you will need to take with you. The stewards in each church will be appraised as to who will be attending and earlier in the week I will assist with seating plans in each church. The stewards will direct you to your allocated seats on the day.

Should you have any visitors attending your church you need to get their details for the Track and Trace list. You need to get their Name, Phone Number, and note the date of their visit and email this, ALONG with the regular congregation's names who were in attendance, every Sunday after the service to Ramsay.

This allows Ramsay to be the point of contact for the Track and Trace system for The Charge should any member be unfortunate enough to get the disease.

For those attending church during the Covid outbreak we have an information sheet for you to assess your personal risk with an explanation attached. This is used within the NHS and other Churches. We DO NOT want to know your personal score but would ask that you confirm either be email or in writing that you have received and read the form. Spare copies will be available in church for visitors etc.

Stewards and Co-ordinators need to ensure that details of everyone who attended the service are passed to the Vestry Secretary by email by each Sunday night. This needs to be undertaken to meet the Track and Trace section of the legislation.
