Christmas Day Services

Given that the three Churches will be holding Christmas Day Services, it does not mean we can have as many as we like in each church. The Laws, Advice and Guidelines laid down by the Scottish Government and the Scottish Episcopal Church must be strictly adhered to. Failure to comply could result in criminal proceedings and adverse publicity at worst or the churches being closed by the Bishop for non-compliance but at the heart of the matter is the well being and safety of our members. That is paramount.

Accordingly entry to any of the three services will need to be booked ahead. In order to comply with the 2 metre rule none of our three churches can exceed a number of twenty. This can be slightly amended with family groups sitting in the one group but, that apart, the 2 metre rule will apply, use of hand gel on entry will be mandatory as will the wearing of masks. There will be NO Carol singing.

St Andrew's is almost full with only a few seats left.

St John's have a full seating plan in operation.

St Regulus - only two people have reserved seats. I will be in touch with them this week to get a seating plan in place. I am well aware that some members of the congregations are unhappy with the arrangements and that I am everything that is bad, fine I can live with that - I am not making these arrangements for the fun of it or because I have nothing else to do, I am doing it in order to comply with the law of the land and the SEC guidelines but more especially to keep our members as safe as I possibly can.

I would be obliged therefore, if you would complete the forms if you wish to attend either St Andrew's or St Regulus on Christmas Day.
