John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire."

And the crowds asked him, "What then should we do?" In reply he said to them, "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He said to them, "Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you." Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what should we do?" He said to them, "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages."

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.

Give thanks to the Lord for this his glorious Gospel.

Octa Voce will again host a Christmas Concert in St Andrew's



First Sunday of Advent

Keep awake! Be watchful! The Son of Man is coming with power and great glory. Hold your heads high, for your salvation is near.

We light the first Advent candle, reminding us how God's promised Messiah will break into our time and space to show us the way of salvation.

May we stay alert for his coming.

Light the first candle.

Sing...(Tune: Away in a Manger)

A candle is burning, a flame warm and bright; A candle of *Hope* in November's dark night. While angels sing blessings from heav'n's starry sky Our hearts we prepare now, for Jesus is nigh.

Come, Lord Jesus.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Second Sunday of Advent

Upon hearing the news that his son would be a prophet of the Most High Zechariah broke into a song of praise.

"And you, child, will go before the Lord to prepare his ways, to give knowledge of salvation to his people by the forgiveness of their sins."

We light the second Advent candle as an act of praise that by God's mercy, the Messiah will come to give light to those in darkness, and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

We light the third Advent candle in preparation for the coming of God's Messiah. We prepare by repenting of our sins, and living lives devoted to loving God and serving our neighbour.

Light the third (rose) candle.

A candle is burning, a candle of *Joy*; A candle to welcome brave Mary's new boy. Our hearts fill with wonder and eyes light and glow As Joy brightens winter like sunshine on snow.

Fourth Sunday of Advent

Good news, God is filling the hungry with good things! Good news, God is lifting up the lowly! Good news, God is about to do his mightiest work! He will cause righteousness and praise to spring forth from all nations.

We light the fourth Advent candle remembering that God's Promised One comes to comfort all who are afflicted and to afflict all who might be too comfortable.

Light the fourth candle.

A candle is burning, a candle of *Love*; A candle to point us to heaven above. A baby for Christmas, a wonderful birth; For Jesus is bringing God's Love to our earth.

Come, Lord Jesus.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
