### + FIRST READING : Isaiah 43:1-7

Thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine.

When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you.

For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour. I give Egypt as your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you.

### + SECOND READING : Acts 8:14-17

The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Hear the Good News of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Saint Luke:

### **Glory to Christ our Saviour!**

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

COGNATE AND SIMILAR MEDICINES ARE ASSIGNED FOR HEALING TO HIM WHO IS TWOFOLD AND CONGLOMERATE:— FOR HIS VISIBLE BODY, WATER, THE SENSIBLE ELEMENT — FOR HIS SOUL, WHICH WE CANNOT SEE, THE SPIRIT INVISIBLE, INVOKED BY FAITH, PRESENT UNSPEAKABLY. FOR THE SPIRIT BREATHES WHERE HE WILLS, AND YOU HEAR HIS VOICE, BUT CANNOT TELL WHENCE HE COMES OR WHITHER HE GOES. HE BLESSES THE BODY THAT IS BAPTIZED, AND THE WATER THAT BAPTIZES. DESPISE NOT, THEREFORE, THE DIVINE LAVER, NOR THINK LIGHTLY OF IT, AS A COMMON THING, ON ACCOUNT OF THE USE OF WATER. FOR THE POWER THAT OPERATES IS MIGHTY, AND WONDERFUL ARE THE THINGS THAT ARE WROUGHT THEREBY.

Having entered a new calendar year, let's all consider the above and find new and exciting ways of living out God's call to us...as individuals and as a church!
