+ SECOND READING: Philippians 3:4b=14

If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless.

Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith. I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.

Hear the Good News of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Saint John:

Glory to Christ our Saviour!

Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him. Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), said, "Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor?" (He said this not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) Jesus said, "Leave her alone. She bought it so that she might keep it for the day of my burial. You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me."

Give thanks to the Lord for this his glorious Gospel.

A NOTE FROM THE RECTOR

Dear All,

Well, the lovely weather has disappeared for now...but it will return. Things are in wonderful bloom! Speaking of that, the trees have been planted all around St Andrew's...thank you Diana, Ramsay and Team for arranging that! PLEASE everyone....be careful when parking.

Next Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week. Let's pray for some nice weather so we can, perhaps, have some wee outdoor processions to mark the day. Our Holy Week Schedule is included elsewhere in this newsletter.

I include the following once again for information purposes...if you have any questions or concerns, please give me a ring or drop an email.

Restrictions are beginning to lift. We will soon be able to receive our Lord's Precious Blood from the chalice again...as well as his Sacred Body. This is cause for rejoicing! I know some will question the wisdom of returning to the common cup...but every precaution will be taken. If you would rather not partake of the consecrated wine, please do not feel you must. There have always been those who prefer to receive only the Sacred Host...and the Church has always been clear in her teaching that the fullness of Christ is received (Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity) in the tiniest particle (or drop) of either the Bread or the Wine. So please do not feel you must partake of both. I propose to begin use of the chalice once again on Easter Sunday (and the evening before at the Vigil). The Sign of Peace will slowly make a comeback too...but as with the above...do not feel you must.

ALSO in keeping with restrictions relaxing, it is time for all our usual ministries to resume...sacristans setting up for Sunday and putting things away, flower arrangers, greeters, hospitality providers, Altar Servers, Eucharistic Ministers and others. All very significant ministries, most of which, were put on the back burner over the past few years.

All those who have been involved in Track & Trace, cleaning and sanitising our buildings and a million other important ministries during this challenging time...we owe you a great debt! THANK YOU.
