The prophet reminds us that we are to bear fruit worthy of repentance.

The Messiah is coming who will baptise with the Holy Spirit and fire and all flesh shall see his glory.

We light the third Advent candle in preparation for the coming of God's Messiah.

We prepare by repenting of our sins, and living lives devoted to loving God and serving our neighbour.

THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

Collect

Stir up our prayers, Lord, and hear us: that they who are sorrowful and suffering may rejoice at the Advent of your only-begotten Son; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end.

+FIRST READING: Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-11

The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the broken hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; to provide for those who mourn in Zion-to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit. They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the LORD, to display his glory.

They shall build up the ancient ruins, they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations. For I the LORD love justice, I hate robbery and wrongdoing; I will faithfully give them their recompense, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them.

Their descendants shall be known among the nations, and their offspring among the peoples; all who see them shall acknowledge that they are a people whom the LORD has blessed.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John.

This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" He confessed and did not deny it, but confessed, "I am not the Messiah."

And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the prophet?" He answered, "No."

Then they said to him, "Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?"

He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,'" as the prophet Isaiah said.

Now they had been sent from the Pharisees.

They asked him, "Why then are you baptizing if you are neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal."

This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.

Jesus grew in wisdom and in stature and in favour with God and people. Luke 2:52 Consider how we might find favour with people. For instance, how we work. What makes a good worker? Most would put obedience, doing what we are asked, high on the list. And reliability. Punctuality. Not wasting time. Listening carefully and checking in with the boss regularly and certainly checking when we don't know exactly how the boss wants a job done. Getting started promptly. Doing the best job possible. Not working to our own agenda, our own ideas, but doing what the employer asks.

Mark's gospel is about Jesus as servant. In Ezekiel's prophetic vision, this is the face of the ox (see Ezekiel 1:10) which tirelessly, with all its strength, serves unreservedly, singlemindedly working for its master. In Mark's gospel, one word which is repeatedly found is the word: "Immediately" or "straightaway".

The servant, our Lord Jesus, goes straightaway, to work, to do his father's will, to be about his father's business. That promptness of response is exemplary. He doesn't think or say "No" and then change his mind. (see Matthew 21:29)

He does and says what he sees and hears the father doing and saying.

The servant who goes about doing good, bringing glory to God and obedient until death, even death on a cross. We will pray to have a mindset, a will and a love to be like this too.
