#### **OPERATION SHOEBOX UPDATE**

Although the weather and illness reduced our number of happy wrappers to 8, we managed 34 boxes in two hours (including a tea break), and with previously wrapped box donations, our number this afternoon came up to 43! Our next scheduled box wrapping session will be from 2-4pm at the Lodge, Fortrose on April 26th. We would still welcome donations of male and female deodorants for the rest of this month. We put them not only into the adult boxes, but the teenagers as well.

#### **SMALLS FOR ALL**

Dear everyone, as you know, I collect the gently laundered bras and new pairs of pants to send to this marvellous charity. Here's a wee update just from February alone!!

There were 1,835 parcels received for the month in February.

300 pairs of pants were sent to the Beatrice Project, an organisation working with the Ntombi Nto Girl Child Network, a registered trust in Zimbabwe. They're supporting schoolgirls by providing access to sanitary products. This enables them to go to school each day when they have their periods.

Demena, a charity supporting women in Northern Ethiopia - were given 1,263 pairs of pants and bras. 20 pairs of pants were included in hygiene kits going to Africa with the Days for Girls (Cuddington) project. Zambia and Malawi Community Partnership working with the Tafika Youth Organisation in the Mzuzu region of Malawi received 1,025 pairs of pants and bras.

River Kids, an organisation supporting children and their families in the West Lothian area received 539 pairs of pants and bras.

Ten Little Toes Baby Bank, and organisation providing essential items to children in West Sussex received 1,075 pairs of pants.

A total of 557 pairs of pants and worn bras were sent to Life Support, a charity that supports people living in poverty in Chingola in the Copper belt of Zambia. The women they support often don't own underwear, and if they do, it's threadbare because they have one bra and one pair of knickers which they wash each night, so they're fresh in the morning.

In Kenya, 60% of girls and women do not have the means to manage their periods except using old rags, ash, bits out of their mattresses, leaves or some just sit in a hole. (Freedom4Girls).

It is difficult to hear about the challenges around managing their periods that so many women and girls face, but Smalls for All tries to support these women and girls through the organisations that produce the hygiene kits.


