Alpha in Cromarty started on Monday night (22nd April) with 12 attendees on different stages of a faith journey. I want to be sensitive to where people are at and not state something they'd be uncomfortable with but probably not all of us would have described ourselves as Christians or churchgoers. As is the format with Alpha, we ate together, watched a talk together (*Is there more to life than this*?) and talked about it. We were a small enough group to all talk together and this worked well.

We are encouraged by this start and as Gillian said recently, there is a real sense of excitement now, waiting prayerfully to see who God will continue to bring and what the Spirit will do in their lives.

We value all prayers so here's a few pointers for prayers we'd really value:

-For God's protection and leading on all those who came (and that, God-willing, they will come back) -For God's protection on all of us who are leading and helping with this

-For those who said they would come and didn't – that some of them might come next week

-For people to continue to help with the catering (both behind the scenes and there on the day – Gillian and Charlotte are doing an amazing job with this. St Regulus doesn't have a kitchen, so we are reheating food in their ovens and driving it down the street to church!)

-For sensitivity for Stuart and myself as we co-host this, and for Judy, Helen and others who support us in the discussion groups. This is a real team effort!

For next week's topic: Who Is Jesus?

A bible passage we have been given is Ephesians 3:16-30. In addition, on my Lection 365 app, the passage was The River of Life from Ezekiel 47. It caused me to reflect on that beautiful imagery of a river of life coming from the temple of God, down through the land, bringing life wherever it goes. May this be so in Cromarty. We pray and hope!

CYCLE THE CHURCHES

What: A sponsored bike ride, around the 5 churches of the Isla Spey Deveron Group (Fochabers, Keith, Dufftown, Huntly and Aberchirder) or as many as you wish to.

When: Saturday 8th June 2024.

Where: Start by going to your nearest church and cycle a loop to as many of the other churches as you choose. A proposed route is available but individuals can follow their own. Individual route plans must be submitted to the organisers prior to Saturday 1st June 2024.

Why: to raise funds for bike stands and covers to be installed at the churches of the group.

Who can get involved: anyone who can ride a bike. Volunteers are also needed to open the churches to check riders through, with refreshments provided at Gordon Chapel and Christ Church Huntly, between 10am -4pm.

A volunteer or volunteers, with a large enough vehicle to hold a bike, is being sought to provide emergency support to cyclists on the day. Although the ride is 'self-supporting' a vehicle is needed in case of accident or bike breakdown which is not repairable at the roadside.
