

FROM BLYTHSWOOD FOODBANK

Dear Churches supporting Highland Foodbank. As always, we're so grateful for donations from individuals and families from your church. Without this support we wouldn't be able to keep up with the demand for Foodbank in the Highlands.

I've attached our May/June list, and I'd be really grateful if you'd circulate this amongst your congregation. I'm sending two attachments, one is an A4 flyer and the other, two A5 flyers. This gives you options as to how you'd like to advertise the list.

Last year we applied for funding for two years to employ a Food Insecurity Adviser within Citizen's Advice Bureau in Inverness. I'm delighted to say that we were successful with this bid, and a new Adviser took up post at the start of April. This will be a huge help for both Foodbank and CAB, in that the FI Adviser will have specific remit for people contacting CAB due to food crisis, helping them to engage with appropriate services. With the positive gains this engagement will bring, it should help reduce the need for Foodbank referrals going forward. We're really excited about how this project will help some people move out of food insecurity.
