On Sunday 23rd June at 1130h at St. Andrew's Church, Fortrose we will hold our annual service of thanks and remembrance for the life and legacy of James Braidwood. This year is particularly important as it is the Bicentenary of the founding of the world's first municipal fire service, established in Edinburgh on 23rd October 1824 and led by James Braidwood. He was killed on active duty on 22nd June 1861 whilst assisting his men at the Great Tooley Street Warehouses Fire, London.

The Scottish Fire & Rescue Service will be participating in this special service, as they do each year, with members of our local fire crews present as well as senior officers from Glasgow and Edinburgh. This service provides us with the opportunity to pay our respects to James Braidwood who dedicated his life to the service of others, as well as to our modern fire fighters who put their lives on the line for us every day.


The next prayer meeting will be on 1st July at 7pm at Rev. Christine's house.
