

OPEN INVITATION TO INSTALLATION OF MR JOHN STUART AS LAY CANON

The Bishop of Edinburgh would like to extend an invitation to all across the Province to attend the Evensong Service at **St Mary's Cathedral in Edinburgh on Sunday 9 June 2024** where the Secretary General of the General Synod of the Scottish Episcopal Church, Mr John Stuart, will be installed as Lay Canon.

The Edinburgh Diocesan Synod agreed earlier this year to honour the retiring Secretary General's long service and dedication to the SEC, and Bishop John Armes would be delighted to welcome people from all dioceses to the service, which starts at **3.30pm**.

At the Diocesan Synod, Bishop John paid tribute to Mr Stuart's "unique blend of skills, legal nous, administrative efficiency, personal charm and above all, devout faith in Jesus Christ".

He continued: "John has never sought the limelight. He seems to understand innately Jesus' teaching that greatness comes through service. But now, as he prepares to step back from his long and faithful service to the church, we want, in our small way, to recognise and to applaud all that he has given the Scottish Episcopal Church by inviting him to become a Lay Canon of St Mary's Cathedral."
